

#### Some Definitions

- Best Practice. A 'best practice' is a practice that has been evaluated and shown to be exemplary in its efficiency and effectiveness.
- Promising Practice. A 'promising practice' is a practice that has shown positive potential but has not been fully evaluated.
- Practical Application. In practical application, best practices and promising practices are typically mixed under the header of 'best practice.'



Why do we need a framework for best practice evaluation?

- Best practice adoption is really about innovation and change.
- Some best practices transfer easily.
- Some best practices require refinement.
- Some best practices just won't work in your organization.
- It helps to have a process that the team can use to quickly evaluate best practice ideas before wasting time on innovation and change that might not work.

#### Twelve Questions to Ask Before Adopting a Best Practice

- 1) Relevance. Does it directly address our need?
- 2) Credibility. Is it supported by a credible person, institution, or evidence base?
- 3) Compatibility. Is it compatible with our existing values, culture and structure?
- 4) Clarity. Do we clearly understand it?
- 5) Simplicity. How simple or complex is it?.
- 6) Advantage. Does it have a relative advantage over what we are already doing and other options?
- 7) **Trialability.** Can we try it on a limited basis prior to full-scale adoption?
- 8) Observability. Will we be able to observe the results within a reasonable period of time?
- 9) Transferability. Can we adopt it as is or will it need refinement?
- **10) Organizational Change.** How much change will it require to organizational policies, procedures, practices, culture, and relationships?
- 11) Affordability. Can we implement it at an affordable cost?
- **12) Value**. Are the potential benefits worth the potential costs?
