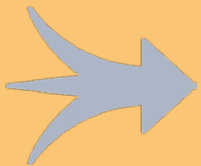

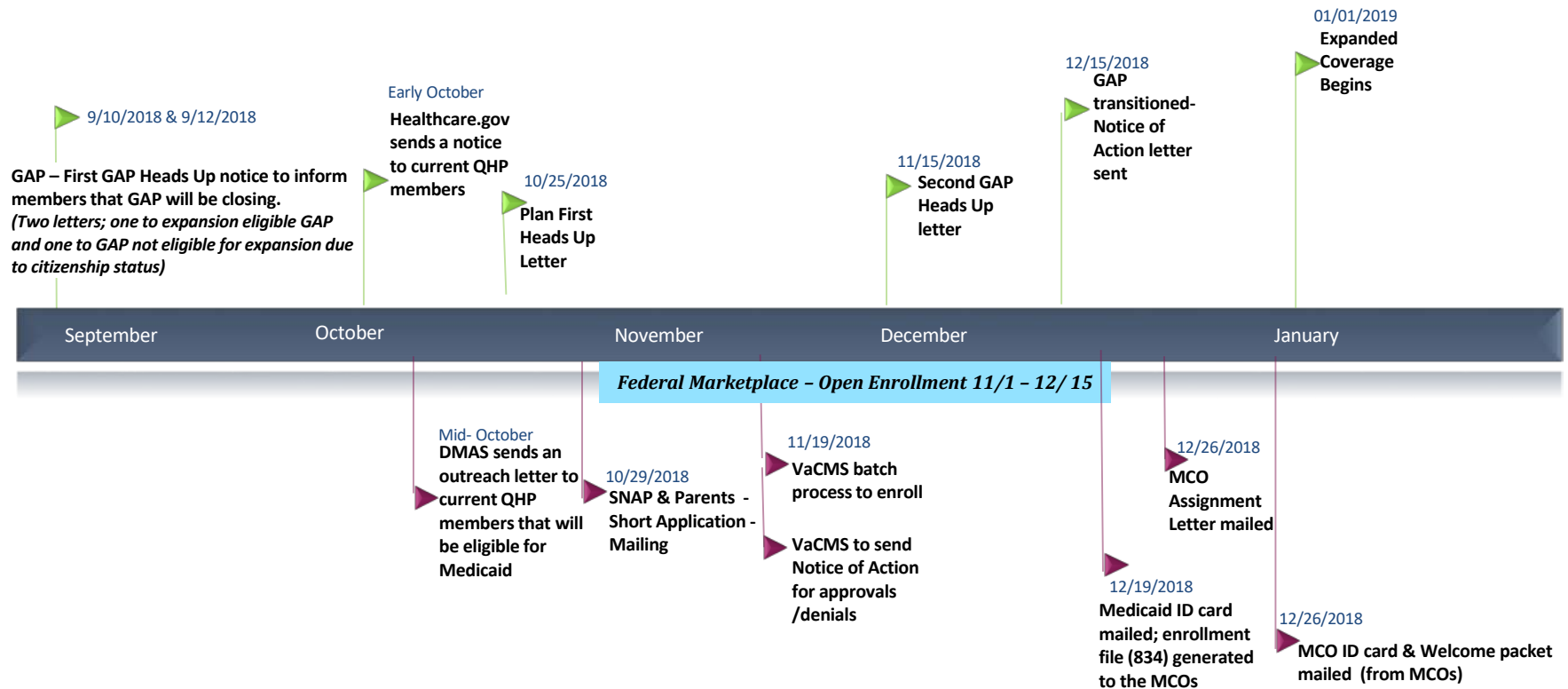

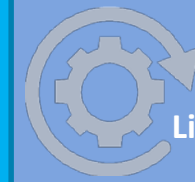

SNAP – Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program; provides financial assistance to households with low income to buy food

VaCMS – Virginia Case Management System; Virginia Department of Social Service’s automated eligibility system

MCO – Managed Care Organization, contracted with DMAS to provide Medicaid coverage to eligible members

Enrollment- Plan First members will stay in their current status until December 31, 2018 and will have full Medicaid benefits starting Jan. 1, 2019. No new applications for individuals with incomes less than or equal to 138% FPL starting 10/31/2018.



Population: Individuals receiving SNAP benefits who are 19-64 years old and have income less than or equal to 138% FPL and no self-employment income
Not eligible for Medicare

Encourage individuals to return Express Application via phone or mail to expedite enrollment

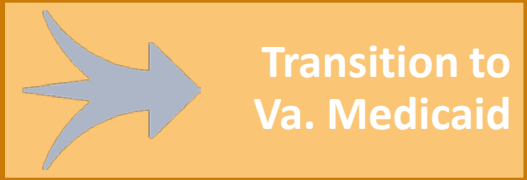

The parent will be assigned to the same MCO as their child, otherwise MCO assignment will be based on their response to the medically complex question on the express application.

Marketplace QHP 101



Population: Individuals who currently have a Qualified Health Plan from the Marketplace and meet the new eligibility requirements.
Likely significant duplication with other populations

1. When individuals update their healthcare.gov account for 2019, the FFE will determine their eligibility (if MAGI) for Va. Medicaid.
2. The FFE will transfer their case to Virginia during open enrollment.
3. FFE will continue to send non-MAGI (Aged, Blind, and Disabled) applications to Virginia as an assessment.

 - Letter from Virginia Medicaid to current QHP members that will be transitioned to Medicaid

Medicaid eligibility will be determined for new MAGI applicants as they apply during open enrollment; communication from DMAS will be ongoing.
